COURSE CREDIT: 1 credit PREREQUISITE: Drama I, teacher approval

COURSE GOALS:

- 5. Students will construct sets using carpentry, technical theatre, painting, and design techniques.
- 6. Students will formulate costs and compare to budgetary needs.
- 7. Students will apply basic knowledge of stage production as art, science, and business, including planning, management, production, and performance.
- 8. Students will demonstrate awareness and appreciation of the universality of human values and experiences of their own and those of other cultures.
