COURSE TITLE: Composition and Rhetoric COURSE LENGTH: 1 year COURSE CREDIT: 1 high school credit; 6 hours college credit through SLU COURSE TYPE: elective (fulfills English III or IV requirement) GRADE LEVEL: 11, 12 PREREQUISITE: GPA of 3.0 or better

COURSE GOALS:

- 1. Students will identify and explain the content, form, structure, elements, and techniques of composition at the college level.
- 2. Students will construct arguments on topics of their choice, employing techniques of rhetoric and argumentation.
- 3. Students will gather source material, evaluate it, and organize ideas for clear presentation to others.
- 4. Students will evaluate the writings of others using standards of successful composition, exposition, and critique.
- 5. Students will complete a formal research paper involving exposition and critique and using proper MLA format for organization, quotation, and citation.
- 6. Students will interpret and respond to works of literature.
- 7. Students will synthesize knowledge gained from course content to produce essays that meet standards of college writing.
- 8. Students will generate grammatically correct sentences which reflect careful and appropriate word choice.

COURSE CONTENT:

- 1. Personal essays: Observation, Comparison and Contrast, Process Analysis, Expository, and Reading Response
- 2. Argumentative essays: Definition, Evaluation, Proposal, Literary Analysis, and Research (on a possible career field)
- 3. Elements of expository writing, critical analysis, and argument
- 4. Research techniques for online and print sources
- 5. Peer review and editing
- 6. Readings from essays and works of nonfiction
- 7. Literature, including classics of British and American literature
- 8. MLA format for incorporating and crediting secondary sources
- 9. Vocabulary enrichment
- 10. Grammar, including identifying and using clausal phrases, avoiding grammatical issues such as dangling modifiers, etc.
