COURSE TYPE: elective (fulfills English IV requirement) GRADE LEVEL: 12 PREREQUISITE: Intro to Lit Studies, GPA of 3.0 or better

COURSE GOALS:

- 1. Students will develop a vocabulary for use in responding to, analyzing, and evaluating film.

- 3. Students will recognize techniques in practice through watching films and excerpts.

- 6. Students will generate analytical essays responding to, comparing, and assessing films, using techniques appropriate for college writing and film studies.
