COURSE TITLE: Introduction to Literary Studies

COURSE LENGTH: 1 semester

COURSE CREDIT: 0.5 high school credit;

3 hours college credit through SLU

COURSE TYPE: elective

(fulfills English IV requirement)

GRADE LEVEL: 12

PREREQUISITE: Composition and Rhetoric,

GPA of 3.0 or better

COURSE GOALS:

1. Students will identify and explain the content, form, structure, techniques, and themes of literature at the college level.

- 2. Students will analyze and interpret short stories, poems, drama, and novels, including a variety of authors, periods, and subjects.
- 3. Students will compare works from various periods and genres and will assess relationships among pieces of literature.
- 4. Students will produce analytical essays on literary subjects, demonstrating advanced composition techniques, proper MLA format for organization and citation, and sophisticated sentence structure.
- 5. Students will evaluate the writings of others using standards of successful analysis and argument.
- 6. Students will generate essays that meet standards of college analysis and composition.

COURSE CONTENT:

- 1. Short stories, written by a selection American authors
- 2. Poems, representing a variety of forms and styles
- 3. Drama, including *The Glass Menagerie*
- 4. Peer review and editing
- 5. Response essays
- 6. Analytical essays
- 7. Literary techniques, including symbol, irony, allusion, etc.
- 8. Principles of literary theory and critique
