COURSE CREDIT: 0.5 credit PREREQUISITE: Intro to Business

COURSE GOALS:

1. Students will recognize the evolution of the law and describe the differences between criminal and civil law.

- 2. Students will interpret business ethics and reason based on consequences as to why we are obligated to obey laws.
- 3. Students will name the various levels of court and illustrate the structure of the federal and state court system.
- 4. Students will recognize the crimes that commonly occur in the business environment and the elements present in all crimes.
- 5. Students will classify items as real or personal property and identify the legal process for transferring ownership of realty.
- 6. Students will indicate the legal characteristics of a lease and explain the duties of landlords and tenants.
- 7. Students will recognize the importance of a will and trust.
- 8. Students will describe employment contracts and differentiate the duties of an employer and an employee.
- 9. Students will compare legal and illegal discrimination in the workplace and name the laws for discrimination.
- 10. Students will discuss the relationship among negligence suits, workers' compensation, and OSHA.
