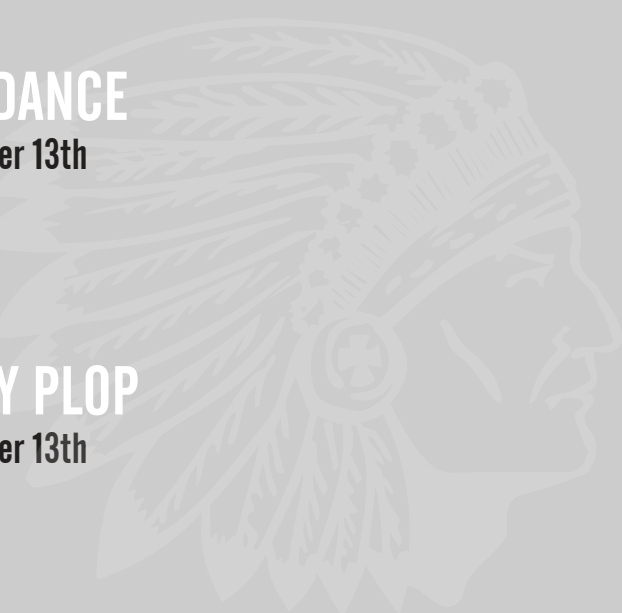

Point system for judging the floats: Beauty of the float (40 pts), Artistic Effort (30 pts) - if two floats are tied overall, the one with moving parts would be judged higher.

Drinking on or around a float will automatically disqualify that class from the competition.

Float dimensions are as follows: Width 13' maximum, Length - No limit.

Monetary prizes will be awarded at half time of the football game.

1st prize is \$150

2nd prize is \$100

3rd prize is \$75,

Honorable Mention prize is \$50

Decision of the judges is final.

All drivers of floats must remain with the float until after halftime.

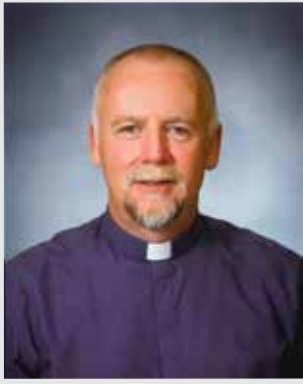
Failure to stay with float will disqualify your class float from competition.

I was a principal at Caruthersville High School and Schultz Middle School in Cape Girardeau, assistant superintendent for Cape schools, and superintendent for the Meadow Heights School District. After retiring from public schools in 2012, I returned to the classroom as a teacher at Notre Dame Regional High School and then at St. Vincent de Paul in Cape. In 2013 I was ordained a permanent deacon.

My lovely wife Rose and I were married in Apple Creek. She works in the parish office at St. Vincent de Paul in Cape. We have two wonderful children, Noah who is a senior at The University of Mary and Jordan who is a sophomore at SEMO. My family has been a huge blessing to my ministry.

I am extremely excited to begin in my new role at St. Vincent DePaul in Perryville. The school community has a rich history and provides a strong foundation upon which to build. I pray that my experience as an educator and deacon will allow me to serve our community well. Pray for me as I begin this ministry!

1. One of the new faces on the faculty, the new Head of Schools is Deacon Rob Huff .Other new teachers are Erin Gholson in Social Studies, Heather Baskin teaching English, Desho'n Pernell teaching Spanish and Matthew Hayes teaching Math. Welcome to St. Vincent Faculty!
2. The information received from Morgan Wheeler, secretary at the St. Vincent Jr. High and the High School, is the total number of students at the present time is 236, but is still changing daily.
3. The new President of the St. Vincent Alumni is Clint Brown, a 2010 graduate of St. Vincent High School.
4. St. Vincent High School is very fortunate to have such a variety of sports, due to the Alumni supporting them and the following coaches. Volleyball- Amy Umfleet and Sara Hennemann (1990), Cheerleading-Katie Franklin (2012), Track- Eric Gholson and David Hudson, Cross- Country-Zac Schumer (2015) and Emilie Steele, Golf- Tom Prost (1977), Girls basketball-Gary Poyner and Wes Pruett, Football- Tim Schumer (2012), Boys basketball- Bruce Valleroy (1981), Baseball-Cory Sauer (2010), Soccer- Caitlin Pistorio (Hoeh-2003). The Athletic Director for all sports is Bruce Valleroy.
5. The first person to make history for St. Vincent High School in Track and Field Class 2 State Championship, by winning the 400 meter dash with a time of 49.91 seconds, winning the first individual State Championship medal was Senior Trevor Lukefahr. Trevor earned the title of "Track and Field Athlete of the Year! Congratulations Trevor!
6. The people that volunteer to mow and trim the Football field are Bob Prost (1970), Chauncey Carron (1951) and Bruce Valleroy (1981). Thank you gentlemen!
7. The sports team that won 2 State Championships in a row were the 2017 and 2018 girls Soccer team! Congratulations team and coach!
8. The fire that destroyed the cafeteria, furnace room, janitors' room and 2 rest rooms in thebasement and 2 classrooms on the second floor was September 26, 1969. Two young boys, Scottie Brown (1977) and Gary Nesslein (1977) were playing basketball on the playground and noticed smoke in the school basement. The alarm was turned in at 4:05 P.M. All Perryville firefighters and the 2 trucks and equipment were dispatched to the scene and Chief Pete Hoffmans' crew had the blaze under control by 8 P.M. It was thought the fire was caused by faulty wiring.
9. After the fire, a large group of volunteers cleaned some classrooms at the St. Marys' Seminary and the students were taken there each day by parents. The students finished that school year at the Seminary classrooms.
10. The brick school building was built in 1916 as a Catholic High School, but was later converted to an Elementary facility when the new High School was built in the 1950's. St. Boniface had K-2 and 3-8 were at the old High School. The Principal in 1969 was Sister Mary Teresa.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Chad Wheeler (2006) was the keynote speaker for the SV 2018 commencement ceremony. He spoke of his families tradition and ties to St. Vincent extending from his mother Kathie Wheeler graduating in 1967. Chad's goal was to reach out and speak to the graduates about things that will likely affect them in the immediate future. This included three topics — FAMILY, FAITH and FAILURES.

FAMILY--While family in the traditional sense is vital to all of us, graduating from St. Vincent gives you something not everywhere offers. You have your St. Vincent family.

FAITH--personal challenges of entering college or the work force and leaving a Catholic community into often less accepting groups and communities that aren't as ingrained in Catholic religion or even Christian faith saying, 'When people don't understand something or aren't a part of something, like the Catholic faith, there can be a tendency to demean it. You are going to experience this...'

FAILURES--"When failure happens, because it will, take the next step, because you will learn and find something greater in its place"
