St. Vincent High School Advisory Program

The St. Vincent High School Advisory Program is a support system for students, in which advisors support the academic, social, and emotional growth of each advisee. Advisory Groups consist of 10-12 students from all grades levels, grades 9 thru 12. Groups are diverse in age, gender, strengths and needs. Students remain with the same advisor for their entire high school career.

Goals of Advisory

Advisors will meet with their advisee group 10 to 12 times.

Advisors will get to know each advisee, their interests, strengths, needs.

Advisees will feel a part of a smaller community, their Advisory Group, and get to know each other and learn to work together.

Advisors will follow the academic progress of each advisee, and meet with each advisee at each mid quarter and quarter end, and provide feedback and encouragement.

Advisors will assist in the course selection of their advisees during registration in the spring. Older students will have an opportunity to mentor younger students in Advisory.

Advisory Group will also have a social component. The group may do a special activity for Christmas, celebrate birthdays, plays games, etc, to foster a community atmosphere. The group may also be a support for any student that may go thru a tough time (extended illness, loss, etc).
