Meet the New Principal of SVHS Dr. PatHensley

As a means of introduction, a year ago August, I accepted a position as Head of School (President) in a third world, developing country, St. Christopher-Nevis, at the Immaculate Conception Catholic School. Initially it was expected that the position would be a three year commitment, however; economics minimized the position to one year.

Originally from the St. Louis area, I have been an elementary and secondary Catholic school principal for over twenty-five years (St. Mary Magdalen, St. Elizabeth Academy, St. Francis of Assisi, and Ursuline Academy). As principal, I was responsible for the overall operations of each school in the areas of curriculum, helping to design strategic planning structures along with long-range planning and program assessment, creation of school budgets and expenditures, student recruitment and admissions, faculty recruitment and evaluation, faculty professional development, marketing and public relations and working with Capital Campaign cabinets to meet with donors, present school strategies and plans, and to request financial commitments. Under the leadership of Dr. John James, Director - Catholic School Leadership Program, I have been employed for St. Louis University teaching Public Relations and Research Methods, as well as Mentoring Doctoral and Masters' students wishing to achieve their Principal certifications. I was employed for Srake and Hensley, LLC, using online services to address questions on research methods and provide statistical design suggestions for Education doctoral students throughout the United States.

My role is President of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Schools. It is a new concept, whereby the President plans for the future of the schools (along with others, of course) and acts as a catalyst for change. As President, via the organizational chart, the principals answer to me, along with all other employees. In essence, I am the CEO of the "company".

My interest in SVdP was the feeling of being "one" with the charism of the Vincentian community - service to the poor - and the opportunity to be the President of the school SYSTEM. While at Ursuline Academy, I developed an annual Program called "Ursuline Schools Unite in Service", which brought students from throughout the USA to work with the homeless and the under-served in a variety of areas in the United States.

Being able to work with the school community members (teachers, principals, parents, boards and PTO members) to plan for the future of SVdP – CS (St.Vincent de Paul Catholic Schools – Pre-K through 12th) is exciting and extremely important. SVdP-CS has a rich tradition in education that is grounded in the Catholic Faith and has developed literally thousands of men and women into faith-filled, productive citizens.

I am thrilled to become a member of the SV community and know that working together (with God's help) we can accomplish great things for our Catholic Schools!

Meet the New Principal of SVE Mr. Tim Thompson

What does a high school theatre teacher have to offer a thriving elementary school? More than you might at first think! As many people may remember, I taught high school theatre for 18 years and directed more than 100 theatre productions. My last six years of teaching were at SVHS, and they were the best years of my career. In 2006, I left SVHS to become an elementary principal in Sikeston, MO. I asked myself that same question then because I wasn't sure I had the makings for an elementary principal. But here is what I found out:

Elementary age kids NEED a strong male role model that care about them. I had the creative streak that is really a part of almost every elementary educator. I knew how to treat kids fairly, consistently, and reasonably. I know how to listen to the students and their parents. I make use of my directing and motivating skills. I channel my directing vision into directing the vision of curriculum and instruction. I principal as a father...I treat them as I would my own kids, dispensing love and tough love as needed. I know how to celebrate the accomplishments of students and staff.

I know how to develop a living curriculum that is adaptable to the needs of students. I love this school, the staff, and the good people of this parish. I knew as soon as I left that I had lost something awesome, and have prayed to come back. I am meant to be here.

What I've learned in the past six years in school administration will help me serve the children and staff of SVES in the best possible way. I will focus on relationships, partnerships with staff, parents, and community. I will, with the help of the staff, create a climate that makes working and learning at SVES even more desirable. I will make sure that the social, academic, and faith facets of the children will be the focus for us as we educate them in a Christ-centered environment. I want these children to succeed.

I hold a BS degree in Secondary Education: Speech Communication and Theatre. I attained my Masters in Educational Administration in 2005 and my Ed Specialist Degree in Educational

Administration in 2010. I am certified to be a principal from K-12 grade and as a school superintendent. In 2008, The Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals (MAESP) named me the Exemplary New Elementary Principal of Southeast Missouri. I continue to teach college courses as an adjunct instructor for Mineral Area College and Southeast Mo State.

Congratulations to all of the scholarship recipients. The total amount of scholarship monies offered by colleges, universities, businesses and organizations to the SVHS Class of 2012 reaches approximately 1.2 million dollars. The amount accepted was \$512,995. 100% of the graduating class is attending college.

Float Rules

• The float MUST have the school colors (blue and gold) somewhere on it.

• The year of graduation must be on the float somewhere (it is not required in the theme).

• Point system for judging the floats: Beauty of the float (40 points) Artistic Effort (30 points) - if two floats are tied overall, the one with moving parts would be judged higher.

 Drinking on or around a float will automatically disqualify that class from the competition.

• Monetary prizes will be awarded at half time of the football game. 1st prize is \$150, 2nd prize is \$100, 3rd prize is \$75, Honorable Mention prize is \$50. Decision of the judges is final.

• Float dimensions are as follows: Width 13' maximum, Length - no limit.

• All drivers of floats must remain with the float until after halftime. Failure to stay with float will disqualify your class float from competition.

Market Day

One of the goals for the St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Schools this year is to unify the fundraising efforts of both schools. One of the major PTO fundraisers this year is Market Day. On a monthly basis, people can order grocery items online or by completing a paper order form and turning into school by the monthly deadline. The food is delivered to the school for pickup on a scheduled day each month. Something new that we are offering is FREE LOCAL DELIVERY to homes or local businesses from 4-6 p.m. on the scheduled delivery day. The schools make approximately 30% profit on this fundraiser. Last year with only 60 families participating, we netted \$9,000 in profit. With everyone's help, we hope to double both the number of families participating and the profit.
