We appreciate and thank our parishioners, alumni, and friends whose contributions continue to enhance the mission of the Church and the effectiveness of our educational systems.

I never want to see a Perryville without St. Vincent Schools! I know you feel the same, which is why I am asking you to increase your support of the church, which currently funds over half of every student's tuition.

The legacy of Catholic Education in our parish continues today because our families and alumni are willing to make the financial sacrifices to ensure a bright future. Our schools urgently need more financial support, but we also need something even more fundamental—we need to show up for one another, to do our part by practicing our faith, attending mass, celebrating the sacraments, and caring for the poor and needy.

Jesus Christ is the font from whom all our blessings flow, without whom all our efforts are in vain, who speaks to us and nurtures us in and through the sacraments of the church.

The faith we profess and celebrate with our children is the foundation of Catholic Education. Catholic education makes no sense if we are not practicing our faith!

Because our annual tuition increases cover only a small portion of the actual increases in cost, our future depends completely on your charity and generosity. I am begging you to increase your financial support and to become more active in the life and mission of the church.

As our culture becomes increasingly hostile to Catholic values and beliefs, the need for Catholic Education has never been more apparent. Our country needs us to defend our values, to teach our faith, and to be responsible, and intelligent citizens capable of leading and effecting change. No better venue for Catholic evangelization exists!

It is now our turn to invest in the future of our Church and, by extension our nation, and to ensure that the next generation of SV students is well-prepared to live faithful, holy, and successful lives as practicing Catholics.

I know a family whose monthly tuition is half their monthly income. They are convinced the value Catholic Education for their children, for their family and for the Church makes every sacrifice a privilege and not a burden.

One of our students begged his parents to let him attend our High School. Sadly, his parents had to tell him they could not begin to afford SVHS. Undeterred, he met with me and asked if there was any way we could help him. I found a donor for his tuition and this young man's dream of attending SVHS became reality. He is a straight "A" student whose gratitude will no doubt be manifested in his future generosity to SV.

As the actual cost of attending SVHS approaches \$9,000 per student, we are blessed to be able to subsidize every single student with a \$5,000 scholarship. There are no limits to the generous love our children inspire!

This year alone, the total parish subsidy given to SVHS students exceeds \$1.5 million! Furthermore, we budget additional tuition subsidies for families in need who qualify. Your generosity makes all this possible.


Most of us have wondered at some point about the sustainability of our schools given the continuing rise in costs and declining contributions. Before we get anxious, it is important to remember our parish history. We know and believe that all our strength lies in our Catholic faith. Our history also proves that we are willing to do whatever it takes to secure the future of our Catholic schools.

To those who say we can't continue to fund our schools, you have historically and emphatically said, "just watch us!". Now is the time to reaffirm that zeal!

The goal to raise enough money to fund our tuition subsidies is entirely doable, but it requires a change in the way we think about giving, and a change in the way we practice our faith. But if we lose touch with the reason for giving, which is building up the Body of Christ, then we miss the point of the evangelical mandate given to us by Christ, "Go, teach, and baptize".

It's hard to believe this is my 4th year at St Vincent! What a joy to watch our students grow spiritually andacademically! Our Class of 2015 completed over 6,900 hours of service to the community and has attained an outstanding year of academics. With a new Learning Consultant for grades 7-12, we hope to better meet the needs of students who have any academic difficulties, particularly those with a learning difference.

Last year, SV won the Top 5% of Catholic Schools in the Nation Award, based on our Religion and Academic programs. Mrs. Mindy (Cattor-2002) House, Business/Technology, won the High School Teacher of the Year through the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Our students, Kayla Winkler and Ethan Holdman, entered a LOGO design to the TG Missouri Restoration Project which was selected to be their National Advertisement/Marketing Design. Our volleyball team went to State and although they came in second, it looks as if this may be a State championship year. Cross Country also went to state, with the Boys placing 2nd in State and Girls placing 9th. The SV ACT Average for 2015 is 23.4 compared the National ACT Average of 21.8.

New this year as part of our Global Technology plan, the High School students begin using Google Chromebooks instead of laptops – new carts and 60 Chrome Books have been purchased. The faculty will begin using Google Chromebooks and Google Apps in the classroom via Wireless Network. In future years, 9th grade students will purchase their own Google Chromebook to pay over 4years until all students have their own.

FOCUS ON CURRICULUM

Since 2013-2014, SV faculty have been trained to develop Quad D lesson plans, which focus on rigor of content and relevance in the real world. The goal of this type of planning is to engage students in their learning—by asking questions of "import" and leading students to understand the topic's relevance in today's world. Here are some of the lessons that were used during 2014-2015.

Students might have noted the activities in Math class including using Trigonometry to measure the height of our parking lot light-poles, determining the probability of rolling a die, or figuring the probability of choosing a particular color of M&M's in a bag based on his/her bag of candy.

Our Business students studied elements of microeconomics and the nature of demand. Each group of students studied a product of choice and created a demand schedule using a table format and distinct between price and quantity demanded by creating a demand curve using a chart illustration.

In an English Poetry Unit, students focused on the poem "Invictus" by William Ernest Henley. Before reading and analyzing the poem, students researched Timothy McVeigh (Oklahoma Bombing) and Nelson Mandela (South African Hero), two very different people who were both inspired by this poem. Students will compare and contrast McVeigh and Mandela, share findings with the class, analyze the poem, and engage in discussion about the two men and the poem overall.

In Religion class students were studying Ignatian Prayer (a form of prayer in which one uses his or her senses in an imaginative way to reflect on a Gospel passage; using one's senses, seeing, hearing, tasting, touching, and smelling to make the Gospel scene real and alive). After reading the passage twice, they were asked to imagine the seen and consider: What does Jesus look like? How do the others react to him? What are the people saying to one another? What emotions fill their words? Is Jesus touching someone? Put yourself in the scene: either as an observer or a participant. Once each student had constructed the scene they separated into groups (according to bible passage) and determined 5 things you saw in your imagination, three sounds you heard, and one thing you smelled, tasted, or felt with your sense of touch. Then they created a skit about the Gospel passage, which was performed for the class.

We will continue this form of student-engagement during 2015 -2016 which often uses technology to research information, design presentations (Prezi or PowerPoint) or develop "Glogs", tech-posters, etc.

We have some exciting things happening in the Elementary School this year that will benefit our students and help promote this year's theme of "Every Act of Love." The building has been outfitted with an all new wireless internet computer system which will benefit student usage in the areas of technology based learning. We have decided to put a special focus on Mathematics this year by implementing a brand new weekly skills and assessment program in order to track progress and achieve individual student goals in many different math skill areas.

Although we no longer have Mrs. Ronda Rowland as a full-time 5th grade teacher, we are very excited to have her serve the Elementary School as a part-time specialist for the current 5th grade students. She will be a valuable asset in assisting the students in key areas on a small group and individual basis. We have been able to create an additional small classroom to be used for more intervention strategies to assist students in their individual areas of need in small group sessions or one-on-one instruction by the teacher and teacher aide.

A special thank you goes out to our Alumni who have given their valuable time, money and resources in order to make St. Vincent DePaul the wonderful educational organization that it has been for many decades. Your work will always be noticed and supported by those of us honored to serve this parish.

The Baseball team under first year Coach Tyler Search finished the year with a 12-10 record. as Co-Champions of the Jefferson County Small Schools Conference. They ended the season with a 2nd place finish in Districts.

The Girls Soccer team under 1st year Coach Caitlin (Hoeh-2003) Pistorio finished the year with a 13-10 record. The girls also finish 2nd in the Districts, losing 1-0 to the eventual state champions Saxony Lutheran.

The Golf team had another successful season and qualified four players to Sectionals.

FLOAT RULES

The float MUST have the school colors (blue and gold) somewhere on it.

The year of graduation must be on the float somewhere (it is not required in the theme).

Point system for judging the floats: Beauty of the float (40 pts), Artistic Effort (30 pts) - if two floats are tied overall, the one with moving parts would be judged higher.

Drinking on or around a float will automatically disqualify that class from the competition.

Monetary prizes will be awarded at half time of the football game. 1st prize is \$150, 2nd prize is \$100, 3rd prize is \$75, Honorable Mention prize is \$50. Decision of the judges is final.

Float deminsions are as follows: Width 13' maximum, Length - No limit.

All drivers of floats must remain with the float until after halftime. Failure to stay with float will disqualify your class float from competition.

The queen was Jo Ann Lurk Hayden. Al Schrenk, an SVHS student, and his orchestra rode in the parade playing their music. The Alumni president was John Lottes II.

- 9. The Alumni dance at the first Homecoming in 1949 was held at Scotties Club. Both teams and coaches were introduced.
