 2. Students will define terms relating to the study of geography.
 3. Students will recognize and analyze the earth's geologic features, systems, and climates.
 4. Students will relate how culture affects all aspects of a society's life and how geography has contributed to culture.
 5. Students will describe the causes and effects resources and the environment have on the world's nations.
 6. Students will examine the physical, historical, economic, and human geography of select areas of the world.
 7. Students will create maps related to select areas of the world.
