COURSE GOALS:

- 1. Students will earn six hours of college credit through St. Louis University.
- 2. Students will identify various themes of continuity and change in the social, economic, and political history of the western world.
- 3. Students will demonstrate examples of interdependency among the nations of the western world.
- 4. Students will recognize the importance of geography in the history of the western world.
- 5. Students will use the tools of social science inquiry in producing research projects, papers and web pages relating to western civilizations.

COURSE CONTENT:

- 1. The first civilizations, Greeks, Romans, Judaism, Christianity
- 2. The Middle Ages, Byzantium, Islam
- 3. The rise of nations, Renaissance, Reformation, conflict, exploration, expansion
- 4. Divine right monarchies, old regimes, Enlightenment, French Revolution, and Napoleon
- 5. Romanticism, reaction, revolution, Industrialism, modernization of nations, and Imperialism
- 6. Great War, Russian Revolution, crisis between the Wars, democracies and the non-western world
- 7. Second World War and its aftermath, twentieth century ideas and writings, current world issues
